First I will and bequeath my body to the grave and my immortal Spirit to the Lord who gave it.

Second it is my will that all my Just debt be paid if any should be of outstanding against me at my death out of my property and the balance to go as hereinafter mentioned.

Third I will and bequeath to my two grand sons Thomas Smith & John W. Smith the following property to wit; six head of sheep three ewes one weather and two Rams, three head of hogs one large Chest made of Birch material, one leather Bed, two Pillows, three Shirts, four bed-quiltedding the furniture to the said Bed, one large pot, one Skillet, one frying pan, one Smoothing iron, three Slaps, two Dishes, one Testament, two hymn Books, one wine Sifter, one Porcelain tray and three Pitchers and one third part of an undivided lot of land No 229-13-3. two hundred and twenty nine in the thirteenth district of the third section the same situated lying & being in the County of Murray and State aforesaid I give and assign the aforesaid parcel of land to my two beloved grand Children the same containing fifty three & one third acres more or less to have and to hold the aforesaid parcel of land to the said Thomas & John Smith the to their own use and benefit forever in fee Simple.

To the use and intent the the said will and testament may come into full effect I hereby appoint my three sons John Smith Junr, Eliza Smith and Levi Smith my Executors hereby revoking all former wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
