I give, bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Malinda, with whom I have lived in quiet and harmony for a number of years, lots of Land No 177 and 178 one hundred and seventy seven, and one hundred and seventy eight, in the 2nd district, Second Section Cass County, being the plantation whereon I now live, together with all my perishable property of every description, that I am now possessed of, of every kind whatsoever, together with a lot of land, situate, lying and being in the County of Forsyth, formerly Cherokee, and numbered eight hundred and forty two, in the second district of the first section, which last mentioned lands together with a sufficient amount of my perishable property to pay all my just debts. I hereby authorize and direct my Executrix to sell either at private, or public sale as she may think proper, and at the termination of the life or widowhood of my beloved wife, then, all the lands and perishable property of every description, to be equally divided betwixt all my beloved children, (except Oliver C. to whom I have given my deed, what I deem his equitable part) To wit: Parnell, Mary M., Eliza S., Sarah A., Emily, Georgia Ann, Harriet W. Rebecca J.

Item 4th. I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Malinda, Executrix, & my beloved son Oliver C., Executor, of this my last Will and Testament, this December the 2^d 1852.
