 twenty dollars, (in order to make it equal to the bed left.

(4th) I will and bequath to my son James Hipps Eighty Dollars.

(5th) I will and bequath to my daughter Anna Simpson wife
 of Matthew, Eighty dollars, and my silk Handkerchief to be hers
 for her own use and for the use of her children, so that
 her husband may not dispose of it.

(6th) I will and bequath to my daughter Sarah Neighbors
 wife of William Neighbors Dec? Eighty Dollars.

(7th) I will and bequath to my son Joseph Hipps Eighty
 Dollars.

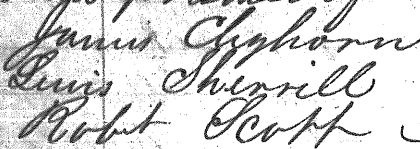
(8th) I will and bequath to my daughter Rutha McIntire,

 of Elizabeth and Joseph Hipps my Chest.

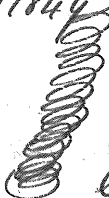
(10th) I will and bequath to my Grand son Joseph Hipps my gun.
