of the County and State aforesaid, being of sound disposing mind, but aged and bodily infirm, and knowing that it is allotted for all men once to die, & that is uncertain with me as with all others, as to the time when God's messenger death shall waft my soul from this earth, to the world from whence there is no return, I therefore make this my last will and Testament.

First of all. I assign my soul to God who gave it trusting through the merits of Christ the Redeemer it may be sound, together with all who serve the living God, in sincerity and in truth.

Next desire that my son William Jackson enjoy as his own right and property, my lot of land that I live on, thousand and thirteen (1013) in the 4 district of the third & Section in Case County and said State, and a negro woman by the name of Dice. I also wish my ^{said} son William Jackson, to have as his own property, and it is my request that he take care of her as long as she shall live, and I the said Mark Jackson do hereby the presents, give to the said William Jackson at my death the right and title to the same.

Next. It is my wish for ~~Mark Jackson~~ my Grand
Son, and Son of Floyd Jackson, to have my Shot
Gun, and I do hereby give it to him at my death.
Next. I do appoint William H. Shaw, and William
Jackson who is my Son in Law and Son, my
Executors or Executors, of this my last will and
Testament, to execute according to law, all
the balance of my estate which is as follows.
viz. all money that I may have on hand at
my death, it is my wish and desire, shall be
equally divided between all my legal heirs after
my burial or funeral expenses is fully paid.
Next. It is my desire and will, that all my household
and kitchen furniture and out property, such
as Horses, Cattle, Hogs, Corn, Fodder, and any
other property, that I may have at my death, may
be sold by the aforesaid Executors according to
law, and all notes and accounts, or so much
of the same as can be collected, and one lot of
land lying in the 4 district of the 4 Section
and no sixteen th. and in Floyd County, it is
my desire should be also sold according to
law, and the money equally divided between
all my children, or legal heirs after all legal
expenses is paid. In witness whereof, the said
Mark Jackson, hath hereunto set my hand
and affixed my Seal, by my mark, in presence
of these witnesses this 12th day of April 1850.
