Item 3<sup>rd</sup> My interest in Hugh's Dying Estate in the  
State of North Carolina I wish my wife to collect  
and receive and the same to apply to the purchase  
of a negro girl, her and her interest if any at the  
death of my wife, I wish should be equally divided  
between my Daughters Sally, Vincy, Elizabeth Eliza  
Mary, Shan and Shan alike

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I wish my son Herman to have the use of  
my Bay mare until he shall raise a Colt.

Item 5<sup>th</sup> I wish my wife to make my Daughters all  
equal with my Daughter Sally, when they leave  
her

Item 6<sup>th</sup> And lastly I appoint my two sons Herman  
and William my Executors to carry this my last  
Will and Testament into full effect this the 21<sup>st</sup>  
Nov in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
