I will to Hugh Campbell in the first place I leave him my Bed
and furniture in the next place I leave him my Trunk in the next
place two bundle Sticks and one large pointer Dish one pair of Spectacles
one Cassimer Shawl to his Daughter Mary Jane also one Shert one
blue Shawl. To Hugh 1 pitcher 1 Mug 1 Small Bowl 7 plates 1 glass
Tumbler 1 wine glass 1 purple Salt Cellar 1 Set cups & Saucers 1 Set knives
and forks 1 Set Spoons 1 Set tea Spoons 1 Potack and Tonge 1 Looking
glass 1 Small oven and tin 1 pair pot hooks 1 white Bowl & one
Umbrella 1 School Bible.

I will the above named articles to Hugh Campbell provided he shall
apply for them in the Space of Six Months after my death if he
does not I will him ten dollars.

I will to James Campbell in the first place fifteen dollars and fifty cents
borrowed money two dollars sent by James Mason at another time four
dollars borrowed one more fifty dollars one pot and frying pan one axe one
iron lodge one pair Tongs. I further will a note given by Jas. Campbell to me
to Robert Campbell his Son also one Small Pot. I will that they shall be
Satisfied with their portion

I will to John P. Stehion all the remaining articles with the exception of
her wearing clothes and spinning wheel which is to go to Thomas Wright besides
one Tub 1 Black Silk Shawl. I do hereby appoint John P. Stehion and
Andrew McDonald Executors in this my will this the fifteenth day of
January 1836
