this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking
all others, heretofore made by me.

I, Thomas C. B. Harris, give and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Emily
Harris, the whole of my estate; and the increase thereof, to
her own proper use, benefit and behoof, forever, with full
power to dispose of the same in any manner she may
think proper, at any time previous to, or by will or deed,
at her death Provided my said wife, Emily Harris, remains
the widow of my body; but if she should ever marry
again, then it is my will and desire, and I hereby command
that immediately after the occurrence of such event,
Executor shall present to the same.

Item 2^d. I give and bequeath to my brother James H. Harris,
as Trustee for my said wife, One of the aforesaid three
equal parts of my whole estate, for her sole and separate
use and benefit, entirely free from all the debts, and oblig-
ations of any future husband, or husbands at the
time of marriage, or any debt or obligation any future
husband or husbands may contract after marriage; and
at the death of my said wife, I desire the whole of this
trust estate to be equally divided between all the children
of her body.

Item 3^d. I will and bequeath, another of the afores-
aid equal parts of my whole estate, to my son
Frank Hardman.

Item 4^d. I will and bequeath the remaining one of
the aforesaid equal parts of my whole estate, to my
son George Dent.

Item 5^d. In the event of the death of either of my
said children, before they arrive at lawful age; it is
my desire, and I hereby direct that the portion of
my estate given to the one deceased, shall all become
the property of the one living.

Item 6^d. I hereby appoint my brothers, Sampson W. James W.
and Stephen H. Harris, the Guardians for my children, I
leaving them to receive, not only each child's portion of
my estate, but my children likewise, and do the best
in the management of their property, and of them, that
a sound discretion, and an affectionate regard will warrant.
I know it is not usual to make such appointments here,
but this is done by me, because of the ill consequences so
frequently experienced in the management of children
by step-fathers; and because, we may belief, it would
be greatly to the advantage of my children, and to the
peace and quiet of all concerned.

Item 7^d. I wish it distinctly understood, that my beloved
wife never marries again, then, the second, third,
fourth, fifth and sixth items of this my last Will
and Testament, are never to take effect.
