of the three beds of which I am possessed (the said Tabitha to have
choice) the real estate to be managed as she may see proper during
her widowhood, and in the event of her marriage, I direct
that it be sold, and she to inherit one half of the proceeds,
the balance to be distributed as hereinafter directed. To my
son Silas, I give and bequeath my other bed as his entire distribu-
tive share of my estate. The balance of my estate I direct to be
sold and the proceeds to be divided among the children of
my son Benjamin, and Sarah Adeline Black, as well as the
remaining proceeds of my real Estate that may arise from the
above mentioned contingency share & share alike. I do hereby
nominate and appoint Saml B. Underwood, Executor of this
my last will and Testament. In testimony whereof I William
Storall being of sound and disposing mind and memory have
hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty first day of
February in the year 1845.
