

Will of Mrs. Annie Gray

Georgia, Benue County:

I, Mrs. Annie Gray, of said State and County, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament.

First: I give, bequeath and devise to my son George Gray, all of my personal property of every kind, character and description, consisting of all my household and kitchen furniture, all of my stock of cattle - there being about thirty-three (33) head in number at this time, together with whatever increase there may be at the time of my death; and one sugar mill and kettle.

Second: I also give to my son, George Gray, the exclusive custody and control of all the household goods now in my possession belonging to my grand-child, Rachael Malissa Gaskins, same to be held in trust by him for said Rachael Malissa Gaskins, to be delivered to her at the time of her marriage, or, at such other time, as in the judgment of my son, George Gray, she is capable of receiving and properly using and caring for the same.

Third: I hereby constitute and appoint A. L. Aikin sole executor of this my last will and testament and I expressly confer upon him power as such.
