I, E. I. Shockley of said State and county being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and annulling all others, heretofore made by me.

1. I desire and direct that my body be buried in decent and christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and condition in life.

2. I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without unnecessary delay, by executor hereinafter named and appointed.

3. I give, bequeath and devise to my wife Mrs. Ida Shockley for and during her natural life, the lot of land with the improvements thereon situate on the corner Railroad and Hayes streets in the city of Alapaha, being the family residence and known as the "Shockley hotel" giving and granting to my said wife the rentals thereof after paying all expences, including insurance and repair on said building, for and during her natural life, with remainder over at her death to the heirs of my body and ~~heirs~~ and if there be no heirs by our marriage then with remainder over at her death to my son Charley Shockley and if he be dead when this will takes effect, leaving a child or children, such child or children are to take per stirpes in lieu of their deceased parent.

4. I also give and bequeath to my said wife, in the manner as in paragraph three, all my household and kitchen furniture of every sort whatsoever, and also my automobile.

5. I also give and bequeath to my said wife the power of attorney to sell any or all the above described property for the purpose of reinvesting in any way that

she may deem just and proper.

6. - I give and bequeath to my son Charley my gold watch and chain to be his absolutely without accountability in the general distribution of my property.
7. I hereby constitute and appoint L. J. Gray the sole executor of this my last will and testament, and I expressly confer upon him power, as such, to administer my estate, excusing him from giving any bond, or making any returns to the ordinary, and I expressly confer upon the power and authority to sell any part of my estate not heretofore specially devised, at public or private sale, with or without notice, as he may deem best, and without any order of court, making a good and sufficient conveyances to the purchaser and holding the proceeds of the sale to the uses and trusts as heretofore declared in the several items of this my will.
