Last will and Testament of H. Harris.

I, H. Harris, of said State and County being of sound and disposing mind and memory.

do make this my last will and Testament.
Item 1. I wish my executor, as soon as possible after my death, to pay any debts I may owe at my death.

Item 2. My property consists of a certain farm in Berrien County, Georgia, containing 218 acres, more or less, the title to which is in me; and 30 acres, more or less, in the town of Enigma, Georgia, which was in the name of my wife Lucy Harris at the date of her death, but which was really and equitably my property, but in which I have a one fourth legal interest. I value this latter piece at \$1600.00

Item 3. This will go to my children by my above mentioned wife Lucy Harris, to wit, - Charlie B. Harris, Sammie Harris and Clemmie Lee, with the exception of my one fourth interest, and I will that they shall also have that one fourth interest, this bequest giving to said three children the whole 30 acres, more or less, of lot No. 370 in the 6th district of said County, and I value the interest of each in said tract of land at \$400.00.

Item 4. My other children and grand children, by a former wife, Larcena Harris, and those living are, James B. Harris, E. H. Harris, Mattie Pennard Belle Cantrell, and Ruth Abell, and the following grand children, being the children of a deceased son, Willie Harris, to wit, John Rodgers, Ozie Burgamy, Herman Harris, Louine Harris and Willie Harris.

Children representing one heir, also a son Johnnie Harris who went away fifteen years ago and I have not heard anything from him since.

Item 5. I give and bequeath to those children named in item 4. of this will, or the representative of such children, if the children or any one of them be dead,

\$400.00 each, to be given them out of the proceeds of the 218 acres, more or less, of lot of land No. 371 in the 6th land district of Berrien County, Georgia.

Item 6. The \$400.00 bequeath in item 5 of this will to my said children and grand children the grand children named getting one share only so as to represent an heir, or representative of any of the said children should any of them die leaving children before my death, each as set forth in said item, will make my said children and grand children named in item No. 4. of this will equal with the children named in item No. 3. of this will who receive their \$400.00 as already set out from the 30 acres as there described, thus making both sets of children receive \$400.00 each.

Item 7. Whatever is left from the proceeds of said 218 acres, more or less, as above set out, after making these set out in item No. 4 of this will equal with those set out in item No. 3 of this will, shall be divided equally among all of my children, or representatives of children, counting such representatives always as one heir.

Item 8. In the event it shall be found that my son Johnnie Harris is dead and died without lineal heirs, then the portion to be given

all alike, after all are made legal as above set out.

Item 9. In the event any one or more of my children or grand children contest any of the above provisions of this will, and be not successful, then I will that such child, or children, or grand child or grand children, have as his free share only the sum \$10.00.

Item 10 - I authorize my executor for the purpose of the payment of debts and dividing my estate among my children, and making up equal the children or grandchildren of my former wife, Sarcena Harris, with the children of my last wife Lucy Harris, to sell all said 218 Acres, more or less either at public or private sale, and if made at private sale, subject to the approval of the Ordinary of the County.

Item 11 - I hereby appoint James B. Harris my executor.
