Will of John Ray

State of Georgia, I, John Ray of said State and
Berrien County } County, being of sound disposing mind
and memory, do make this my last will and tes-
tament.

Item 1, I desire and direct that my body be buried in
decent and Christianlike manner suitable to my condition
in life.

Item 2. I give and bequeath to my wife Mattie M. Ray
and two minor children to wit; Bulah Estelle and Gulah
Mebille Ray the following property, to wit: One Hundred
and ten acres, more or less of lot of land (#373) Three
Hundred and Seventy three, in the town district of said
County, the same being in the South West Corner of said
lot, bounded as follows, to wit: On the West by original
line, South by original line, East by Camp Bay branch
North by an agreed line; also one horse named
Charley, and 8 head of stock Cattle marked with
my mark.

Item 3. I also bequeath to my wife Mattie M. Ray
and two minor children above mentioned all
the stock of provisions on my place at my
death, also all the household and kitchen furniture
that I may leave at my death.

Item 4, I hereby constitute and appoint my wife Mattie
M. Ray executrix of this my last will and testament,
this the 12th day of October 1894.
