

Stat. of Georgia Berrien County.
Last Will and Testament of Milliard
F. Peewane.

I Milliard F. Peewane of said stat and
County, being of sound and disposing
mind and memory, do make this my
last will and Testament hereby
revoking all wills heretofore made
by me.

Item 1) I wish my executor as soon as
possible after my death to pay my debts.
If a sale of property shall be necessary I
wish him to select for sale that which
can be most advantageously used for
that purpose. and I authorize him some
at public or private sale, as he may
see fit.

Item 2) I give to my beloved wife Martha
Peewane during her natural life a widow-
hood, my entire estate both real and
personal consisting house hold goods
bedding beds furniture, chairs tables
stove, cooking utensils, crockery ware
and in fact all personal property of
what ever nature or character money not
paid accounts live stock of all kinds
horses, mules, cattle & hogs etc. and real
estate as follows. 65 acres more or less of
lot of land #86 in the 10th District of Berrien
County Georgia and being known as the
J. H. Taylor place and bounded as follows
South & East by Wallow bed Creek and
North & West by the original land line of
said lot. Also six acres more or less
of lot of land #87 in the 10th District
of said State and County and
bounded as follows beginning on
the original line in the Run of McCaskey
Bed Branch, and running said Branch
3 Chains & 50 links to Coffee Road
thence along said Road a Northeastly
direction 2 1/2 chains to the

original land line thence South along said original land line 24.90 Chains to starting point the same being in a "V" shape. Also one house and lot in the City of Nashville, Georgia on the corner of McPherson and Henrietta Streets and being 70 by 105 feet.

Also one house and lot in City of Nashville, Georgia fronting on McPherson Street 10 feet and running back same width 200 feet same being the present residence of the said Millard F. Heyane. Also one lot in the City of Nashville, Georgia same being 106 by 113 feet and bounded as follows

North by the present residence lot of Millard F. Heyane, East by Street unnamed, South by lot of Mrs. J. V. Kelley and West by other lands of lot. The foregoing provision is intended in lieu of survey.

If my said wife Martha Heyane should die before my death then and in that event I give and bequeath all of the above

described property to Maggie O. Shaw but should my said wife outlive me, then and in that event, all the above described property to go to my said wife for and during her natural life or widowhood and at her death or intermarriage all described property to go to the said

Maggie O. Shaw. It being the full intent and purpose of this will that if my said wife should outlive me that she is to have said property during her natural life or widowhood and at her death or intermarriage it is my full intent and purpose that all of said property should go to the said Maggie O. Shaw.

Item 3.

I do hereby appoint J. W. Shaw executor of this my last will without bond.
