Item 1-

It is my Will and desire that my body be buried in a decent and Christian-like manner, suitable to my Circumstances and Condition in Life.

Item 2-

It is my Will and desire that a monument be provided for my Grave suitable to my Circumstances and Condition in Life.

Item 3-

It is my Will and desire that all my just Debts, if any, be paid as soon as practicable after my Death.

Item 4-

I will bequeath and devise all my Property, both real and Personal, of what ever kind and wherever situated, to my beloved Wife Dicy Lula Watson, for Her use and benefit for and during her life, and she has the right to sell, convey, do away with, dispose of, or do any thing in reference thereto that she may deem proper, and necessary for Her maintenance and Support and for the upkeep of said Property, with out any Order of Court, and with out the Consent or interference with Her by any other person, Subject only to the expenditures incident to carrying into effect the provisions contained in Items no. 1 - 2 - 3 of this Will and subject further to the obligations on Her part to pay the Taxes on said Property, keep the Property in good condition, repair and preserve it in such away as she may deem best and proper, without any liability to any other person for waste or mismanagement.

Item 5-

At the death of my said wife, it is my Will that all ~~the~~ my Property, both real and Personal not disposed of by my said Wife and not used by Her under the provisions of Item 4 of this Will, be divided among my legal Heirs as now provided by Law to wit, S. S. Watson, M. M. Watson, L. L. Watson, J. F. Watson and the Children of my deceased Daughter Mary Martha Patten

Item 6 -

It is my desire and Will, and I so intend that the
provision made in Item 4 of this my Will for my Wife,
and the Interest thereof conveyed to my said Wife, shall
be in lieu of Power and Years Support.

Item 7 -

I here by name and appoint Two of my Exors, to-wit:
F. J. Watson, J. P. Watson, as Executors of this my
Will, and I hereby expressly relieve them of
making any Inventory or appraisement of my Estate
or from giving any Bond or making any returns
to any Court and all that is required of them
under this my Will is to Probate same, and then
enter upon and take charge of all my Property
mentioned in this my Will, and administer the
same in accordance with the provisions of this
my Will and Testament.
