2nd I desire that after all just demands are paid that my property may all be kept together for the support of and education of the family while my wife Anna lives and remains single, if she should marry before the youngest child comes of age or marries then I desire that the property may be sold to the highest bidder and divided equally between my wife and the children, except that I desire that my lone daughter Elizabeth should have two hundred Dollars more than the rest.
3rd I desire that as the children come to twenty one years of age or marry that they shall have two hundred Dollars paid to them as a part of their legacy.

4th I desire that as long as my wife remains unmarried that my property should be kept together as much of it as shall have been paid out as heretofore directed.
5th I do also desire and appoint my Brother Benjamin Dickson with my wife Anna to execute this will, Oct. 27th 1830
