do make and publish this my last will & testament, hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made. And first I direct that my body be decently interred according to the rules and Ceremonies of the Methodist Episcopal Church. And as to such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to entrust me with, I dispose of the same as follows. First, I direct that all my debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon after my decease as possible, but of the first moneys that shall come into the hands of my Executors from any portion of my real or personal, Also I direct that a fair valuation or appraisement be made by my neighbors to-wit: C. Hamilton, Mr J. Carter & Mr. Pitt. All Part of all my said Estate, and after being signed with their names, that a copy of the same shall be given to each of my Executors. Also I direct that all my real and personal Estate of which I shall die seized or possessed shall be sold or not by my Executors, or any portion thereof, either at private or public sale in their discretion, so far as is necessary to discharge all the just debts against my Estate, either for Cash or Credit, as to them shall seem most advantageous. And to effectuate this my intention, I do hereby vest in my Executors full power and authority to dispose of the same without authority from any Court, in as full & large a manner in every respect, as I could myself do if living.

The balance of my Estate both real and personal after the payment of my just debts, (except such articles hereafter bequeathed as the case may be.) I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Caroline Beale, and my beloved daughter Florida Jane Beale share and share alike, provided that the entire residue of my property after paying my just debts as aforesaid, shall be kept together & under the control and management of my Executors herein after named, until the marriage of either my beloved wife or daughter, upon the happening of ~~which~~ either of which events, the entire property hereby bequeathed, I desire to be apportioned by my Executors between my said beloved wife and daughter. I also direct that the share of my real and personal Estate thus bequeathed to my beloved wife, to be in lieu of her dower, if she shall so elect.

I also give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Florida Jane Beale a negro girl named Amelia in fee simple. It is my will and desire that the Guardians of my daughter herein after named shall, should they deem it prudent and necessary at any time, take such measures as will best become to my said daughter, my property that she may fall heir to by this my last will & testament. And to effectuate this my intention, I hereby give to the said Guardians full power and authority to appoint, or to procure from some competent Court an appointment of some discreet person or persons,

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I do hereby give and bequeath to my daughter Susan S. Smith, my negro girl Margarette, with all her issue.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I do further give to my daughter Caroline my girl Heaten with all her issue, with a bed of furniture & Bureau to be given her at the time of her marriage, or at the age of Twenty one years.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I do further give to my daughter Lydia Ancients, my girl Kelly Ann, with all her issue, a bed and furniture, with a Bureau at the time of her marriage, or at the age of Twenty one years.

Item 5<sup>th</sup> I do give and bequeath to my daughter Mary at the time she reached the age of sixteen years, my boy Elias, with a bed of furniture & a handsome Bureau, or sooner if she sh<sup>d</sup> marry.

Item 6<sup>th</sup> I do give and bequeath to my son Thomas at the age of Twenty one years, my boy William.

Item 7. I do give and bequeath to my son John, at the age of Twenty one years, my boy Josiah.

Item 8 I do give and bequeath to my son Edwin at the age of Twenty one years my boy Alexander.

Item 9. I do give and bequeath to my wife Susan P Howard during her widowhood and no longer, the following negroes. Aggy, Mary, Josiah, Daniel and Adam, with the House and out Houses and various appurtenances therunto annexed, with one acre of Land, embracing the said houses, where I now reside. Also all my Household furniture, my horse and Saddle, cows hogs &c, comprehending all the stock belonging to my premises.

Item 10<sup>th</sup> It is my will and desire, that if my wife on consultation with my Executor, sh<sup>d</sup> think it best to sell the real Estate devised to her, or any or all of the negroes, and put the avails in other property for the better support of the family, she be at liberty to do so.

Item 11. It is my special will and desire that my wife keep the younger children now with her until they are educated, and also keep the property devised to each of the minors until the time limited on the several items for its distribution, and apply the avails to their support and Education.

Item 12. In case my wife should marry it is my will that the property devised to her sh<sup>d</sup> be equally divided amongst my surviving children or their lawful heirs - and the reason why I have limited the possession of the portions allotted her, to her widowhood, is that she is the only surviving heir of her mother, who is able to make her equal to myself in point of property.

Item 13. It is my desire that Laura (a cripple) should remain in possession of my wife, with her mother Aggy, until my daughter Mary shall marry, when she and her issue shall go to her exclusive benefit.

Item 14. I do hereby desire that the remaining one acre and a third of land

more or less, belonging to the Lot where I now reside, that is at present improved, to be sold in such way as my Executors and Administrators may think best, and out of the proceeds I will my lawful debts, which if I have rightly estimated them, do not amount to more than four hundred dollars to be all paid, and the balance if any to be put out at interest until my youngest child is educated, the annual income to be applied to the payment of my childrens Education - And when my youngest child shall have reached the age of fifteen years, the said residue (if any) thus put out at interest shall be divided amongst my surviving children, or their lawful heirs in the following manner. To Elizabeth S. Alden one fourth, and to the others, the other three fourths, share and share alike.

Item 15. I do give and bequeath to my three sons my Library of Books, to be divided by their mother at her discretion.

Item 16. I do give to my Son Thomas Cook, my Silver watch, and all my papers to be used by him as he may think proper.
