mind and memory do make and publish this as my last
Will & Testament, in manner and form following

Item 1st I give and bequeath to my Son Thomas Sherman,
of the State of Alabama, and to his heirs, all the Negroes
I have recently hired to him, and for which I hold his
receipt or obligation together with the money I loaned him to
have and be hold to him and his heirs forever.

Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Eliza West
wife and Consort of Doctor Abner West of Pitt County
a life Estate in the following Negroes, which I have hired to
his said husband, and for which I hold his receipt or
obligation, together with their increase to wit Raglin and
John his wife and her children Jordan Fanny, Aggy,
and her youngest children, and whose names are not
now recollect, together with Peter and Moses Sam Pills
Davis, and a Negro woman purchased from James
Beasley by the name of Lucy - to have and to hold the
said to the said Eliza, for and during her natural life,
and at her death to go to her children share and
share alike to them and their heirs forever

Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my daughter Parthena Raines,
wife of Cardwell Raines of Pitt County, in the State just
aforesaid, a life Estate only, in the following Negroes to wit
Sally, John Edlick, Conline, Fildes, Henry and Jordan
her children Rhoda and her child Daniel and his wife
Lucy, and her children Peter Emily, Caroline, and Pitt and
and her children Jim, Isaac, Washington, Terin and Jack
together with their increase to have and to hold the same
during her natural life and at her death to go to and be
equally divided amongst my daughter Eliza Samson,
and her children and the children of my Son Thomas
Sherman of the State of Alabama share and share alike
provided, however that those who may legally represent my
the said Parthena after her death may if they prefer it
pay to my said daughter Eliza Samson and her children and
the children of my Son Thomas Sherman the sum of ^{five}
thousand Dollars in favor of the Negroes and their

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my son John Hummard for and during his
natural life only, the following Negroes to wit Lydia and her
children Grenville Stephen & Lucy Reuben Rachel and Stephen
a Blacksmith and his wife Dilcy, Jordan and his wife Fanny
and her son Isaac, together with their increase to have and to hold
to him, for and during his natural life as aforesaid, and should he
any child or children, then the said Negroes and their increase to
go to and be vested in them at his death but should he die
without lawful issue or child or children, then the same is to go
to and be vested in my daughter Eliza Lamar and her children
and the children of my son Thomas Hummard of the State of
Alabama these and shall alike, provided however that if there
be who may legally represent my said son John Hummard
after his death should prefer it they may instead of returning
said Negroes and their increase, pay to my daughter the said
Eliza Lamar and her children like the children of my son
Thomas Hummard, the sum of Eight thousand dollars to
be divided among them Shaw and shall alike and provided
further that if my daughter the said Eliza Lamar should
hereafter intermarry, and have a child or children, then and
in that event, she and her child or children by said intermarrying
to have two Shaws each in the final division of said Negroes
or many, in stead of one Shaw each as before mentioned.

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my daughter Susan Rivers
for and during her natural life, the following Negroes to wit
Willis Ben. Reuben Nancy and Betty, also her children Holland
Jas. Dick Mary Easter Frank Betty Minnetta and their issue
and at the death of the said Susan said Negroes, to go to my
daughter Eliza Lamar and her children and the children of my
son Thomas Hummard of the State of Alabama, but in the event
of my daughter the said Eliza Lamar intermarrying, then the said
Negroes and their increase to be divided according to the provision
in the latter part of the 3rd and 4th Item of my will.

Item 6th I give and bequeath to my daughter Eliza Lamar widow of
Benjamin B Lamar, two Negroes to wit Ben & Betty of
which she is now possessed, together with their increase if any also
one Hummard Shaw in Bank Stock in the Commercial Bank at
Macon, and also the further sum of one thousand dollars.

Item 7th I give and bequeath to the children of my son Thomas Hummard
with my sum the same also to the child or children of my daughter
Eliza Lamar who may in like manner survive me come to them
and my grand children, the residue of my Estate of all descriptions
whatsoever, whether of money, good, stock, land, or
other, to have and to hold to them and their heirs forever.

Item 8th I do hereby appoint my two grandsons Philip F and Henry
Laird of the County of Bibb, my Executors, to execute and to carry into
full effect, this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and an-
nulling all other wills and Testaments heretofore made by me.
