Neal Administrator of the Estate of Robert Neal deceased, late of Muscogee County Florida Negro slaves, Novet Adam, valued at Seven hundred & fifty dollars; Skinner, valued at Seven hundred dollars; Beck, valued at three hundred dollars; Anthony, valued at Six hundred dollars, Caroline valued at Five hundred dollars, Fifty dollars, Fanny Lechild Hampton, valued at four hundred dollars; Charlotte Valued at Four hundred dollars; Judy Valued at two hundred dollars; violet Valued at two hundred dollars, and Bradford Valued at One hundred and Thirty seven dollars; the sum being the full of James L. Brad's distribution share of the Negroes of said Estate; with the exception of his Master, being his third, in Roy Henry the title to which Negro is now being litigated in Cobb Superior Court.



State of Georgia. I have hitherto resided in the City of Macon County and State of Bibb County & resided, but now in Peachy

in the State of New Jersey. Knowing that all mankind and being in feeble health but of sound and disposing mind doth it right and proper as respects my family, myself and those with whom I am connected in business to make what in law a disposition of my property and affairs, do therefore make this my last Will and Testament; hereby revoking all others, herefore made by me.

First Item

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid by my executors herein after named, and to raise a fund for this purpose that they or either of them have collected as speedily as possible all the debts due or which may hereafter become due, according to me whether by Judgment, Merchants, Bonds, Notes, open accounts or otherwise, and to receive all Money to which I may be entitled from any source whatsoever, and if it should become necessary for this purpose to sell at public or private sale all or so much and such parts of my real estate or personal property either in the State of New Jersey or Georgia or both as in their judgment shall be most advisable for the interest of my estate and the convenience and benefit of my family to be sold and the funds thus received to be applied to the extinguishment of my just debts as soon as possible.

Second Item

I desire and direct that my interest in the New Store in the City of Macon now and thenceforward for some time conducted by Shewell and Gilbert to continue if the arrangement be construed to my partakers under his management and the superintendance of my executors or such of them as may qualify in Georgia until the 1st of Nov 1848 when said partnership by agreement terminates. Then Shewell and about H. A. But should said Gilbert refuse upon application to continue the business as provided for in the second item then it is my desire that my Speculators or such of them as may qualify in Georgia to divide the stock then on hand with him and to retain my half of the same with the Store and its furniture and fixtures And to continue said business for the benefit of my estate until the close of the present year for which purpose they are hereby authorized and empowered to employ such assistants as may be found necessary - at the end of the year then to sell out the stock less the store room and collect the debts and close the business - The proceeds to be held and applied either to the payment of my individual debts or for the purposes herein after mentioned
