

Probate Court Wills of Adelaide R. Watts deceased
 1851-1865
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Georgia Bibb County } In the Name of God Amen: I Adelaide R. Watts bring in & declare this my Will and Testament by me made, after first paying all my debts if any exist at the time of my Death. I give to my Daughter Henrietta A. Pappora and her bodily heirs if any live and a Half Story house and part of lot which was said house now stands and attached. The said entire lot known in plan of the City of Macon as lot Number one square Number Fifty Seven and if my Daughter Henrietta A. Pappora dies without bodily heirs or heirs I wish it to go to Alexander A. Watts my son. I also give to my son Alexander A. Watts the other part of the said lot with a one story house and said lot. I also wish one negro woman named Matilda if living at that time to be sold and proceeds of said woman to be equally divided between Alexander A. Watts and Henrietta A. Pappora or their bodily heirs. I also wish all my furniture and any other property I may then have to be sold and the proceeds to be divided equally between Alexander A. Watts and Henrietta A. Pappora. I will and bequeath to my Daughter Elconora M. Hodges the sum of Ten Dollars and no more. I appoint Alexander A. Watts Executor of this my last Will and Testament and hereby revoking all other Wills and Testaments by me made. I also appoint Alexander A. Watts Trustee for my Daughter Henrietta A. Pappora. I wish it explicitly understood that Abner Pappora has no interest in my Will whatever the part above any interest to my daughter Henrietta A. Pappora and her bodily heirs if any to her and their sole and separate use and from this and exempt from the control contracts debts or engagements of any husband whatever. Witness my hand & Seal, this day 3d Nov 1861.
