

Last Will and Testament of Archibald Darragh

Bibb County } Archibald Darragh of said County an State

being weak in body, but of sound mind, do make
ordain and constitute this my last will and Testament.
It is my will and desire that I should be decently interred
at such place as my friends shall point out.

2nd It is my will and desire that my executor hereinafter named
shall collect all debts due me, after paying all my debts in the
State of Pennsylvania, pay over any surplus which may
be left, one half to Daniel Darragh to him and his heirs
forever, and the other half to Mrs Beare, during the term
of her natural life, and at her death it is my will and
desire that the portion left to her, during her life, shall
be paid over and delivered to the said Daniel Darragh and
his heirs forever, and if the said Daniel should not
be in life at the time of the death of the said Mrs Beare,
it is then my will and desire that the portion hereby
left to the said Mrs Beare shall be equally divided
among the children of the said Daniel, and it is further
my desire that my said executor hereafter named shall
sell and dispose of all my property in the State of
Pennsylvania and elsewhere, and collect all claims due
me by the government and the proceeds to apply first
to the payment of my debts in Pennsylvania, and the
balance to divide as above directed in regard to my return
friends, or the surplus of my debts between the same
persons, and in the same proportions.

3rd It is my will and desire that my friend Major Davis of
Pittsburgh should make a gratuity of the lot on which
I live to my natural daughter Mary Darragh, this is a
matter however in his discretion.

4th It is my will and desire that my trunk, and all my
clothes, and a papers be sent on to Pittsburgh to my executor
and that he make such disposition of them as he shall
deem most advisable for the benefit of the person here
inafter named as my legatee.

It is my desire that persons indebted to me in this County
should pay over to Charles McDonald the amount due
and that he apply the same to my funeral expenses, and the
expense of my last sickness, and if any surplus forward it to
Neil Darragh of Pittsburgh to be applied as above.

I hereby nominate and appoint my nephew Neil Darragh
of Pennsylvania Executor of this my last will and
Testament.
