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Last Will & Testament of Burrell Parker
 Confederate States of America
 State of Georgia County of Bibb This my last Will and Testament
 I the first I Will and desire after my death that my body shall
 be decently and Plainly buried.
 Item the Second, I Wish all my just debts paid of as soon as
 practicable.
 Item the Third, I Will and desire that all my Estate both real and
 personal to be kept together for the use of my family during my
 Wifes lifetime and if she should die before the present War
 should close then and in that event, I Wish the same kept together
 untill the said War shall close and then and in that event for my
 property of all kinds to be sold or ~~apportioned~~ equally between all
 my children.
 Item the fourth I Will and desire that my Wife Nancy Parker
 and my friend John Dyer shall act as my Executors to carry this
 my last Will and Testament into effect without making any Returns
 at be amenable to any Court.
 Given under my hand and Seal this the fourth day of March in the year
 of our Lord one Thousand Eight hundred and Sixty two (4 March 1862)

 and that all the said Witnesses signed the same in the presence of each
 other and of said Testator.
