being advanced in years and of feeble health but of sound
disposing mind & memory do make public & declare
this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other will
or testaments by me made.

Item 1st I wish all my just debts speedily paid.
Item 2^d After the payment of all my just debts, I give and
bequeath to my daughter Mary Kibbe wife of Wm Kibbe
my two lots or parcels of ground known as lots number two
and three (2 & 3) square fifty seven (57) in the City of Milledgeville
on one of which lots I at present reside. The other lot
adjoining the 1st house & lot occupied by Wm B Watts
also one negro woman by the name of Leah about forty five
to fifty years old also all my household & kitchen furniture
cash on hand at my death notes accounts bonds or other evi-
dence of debt and all my estate real and personal of every
kind for value whatsoever, whenever the same may be situated.
To have and to hold the same to her sole and separate use free
and exempt from the contracts engagements or liabilities of her
present or any future husband for and during the full period
of her natural life, with full power and ability to her to dispose
of the same by her last will as she chooses or thinks proper.
And in case she makes no disposition of said property she will
that then and in that case at her death the whole of said prop-
erty to her children and grand children (if any) share and share
alike the grand children (if any) to take one share in place of the
deceased parent.

And further if my daughter should choose to sell and dispose
of any of the property she is at full liberty to do so and invest
the proceeds of sale in other property to be held by her on the same
terms and just as that now fully conveyed.

Item 3^d I would be glad that it was in my power to be
liberal in gifts to my daughter Julia Cornett wife of John C
Cornett my son Calvin Muldrew son & my daughter Elizabeth
Will wife of Shadrach Will for all of whom I have and then
with the warmest affection and they will properly appreciate my
providing for my daughter Mary who is now with me & has a
large family and who has long nursed me in sickness and in
deaths and needs a home after my decease.

Item 4th I nominate constitute and appoint my grand son
John Kibbe Executor of this my last will and testament.
