Personally came into Court Sam Leberry one of the Subscribing Witnesses to the within Will of Patrick Roach late of Bibb County Georgia who being duly sworn saith on oath that he saw Patrick Roach sign Seal Publish and declare within to be his last Will and Testament and that he was of sound disposing mind and memory and that he signed said will freely voluntarily and of his own accord and he further saith that he saw John McLean and Denis Duce the other subscribing Witnesses sign the same. John McLean has since departed this life, that they all signed in the presence of Testator and in the presence of each other and at Testators Request.

Last Will And Testament of David Allen Decd

State of Georgia I David Allen knowing that I must shortly depart this life being of sound mind and memory, I do hereby declare and make known to my Family and myself that I should make a disposition of the property with which I am provided and I do therefore make this my last Will and Testament, I give and bequeath and devise to my beloved Wife Emeline I have her to acres of land closed and in cultivation including all the Woodland out of the Swamp where my House stands with all the rights members and appurtenances to said lot of land in anywise belonging free from all charge or limitation whatever to her and her heirs forever with full power to dispose of the same at any time previous or by Will or deed at her death as she may think proper, if when said time should be so far south to interfere with the working of the mill I wish then let a set off coming up to within half the distance of the end of the road thence crossing the road East as far as may be necessary around south to West to North Six or eight acres as the Executor shall think necessary for Water works the purchaser to make to make the line fences, I desire that my Wife have two hundred Dollars and their Stock or Progeny & two best sows and their Pigs I wish my Executor the balance of my Personal Property to sell when he thinks best and the balance of the Land I wish to be sold when my Executor thinks best to be to the interest of my children each one to draw a share when are twenty years old all Kitchen and Household furniture to my beloved wife and her money in hand,

I do hereby constitute and appoint my worthy friend Elijah Bond Executor of my last Will and Testament August 1st 1861

Last Will and Testament of Robert P. M. Egan deceased By the name of God Amen, I Robert P. M. Egan being of sound mind and memory but weak in bodily health do hereby make and declare this my last Will and Testament to wit:

First I direct that my just debts be paid,
Second I bequeath unto my mother Rachel Daniel, my wife Margaret Egan, and my three children, Edward, Cook, Margaret Julia and Robert Porter the whole of my estate of all and every description after the payment of my just debts, funeral expenses &c upon the following conditions, viz: that is to say, I desire that my property be kept together and so managed if practicable as to make an annual income sufficient for the support of my mother and wife, and the maintenance and education of my children otherwise that such a portion thereof as may be necessary to secure the above be disposed of to the best advantage for the accomplishment of that purpose during the lifetime of my mother, the widowhood of my wife and the minority of my children, but in the event of my wife's marriage she to draw from the estate one fifth, the remaining four fifths to be kept together for the benefit of my mother and my children as before, and furthermore, as my mother now living with me constitutes a portion of my immediate family, I direct that in the event of her widowhood that she be allowed to take at her bed room and a part proportionate to her household and kitchen furniture.

Third In the event of the death of my mother and my three children in minority I direct that the estate heretofore set apart be equally divided as follows viz: one third to my wife Margaret Egan and the balance of her body and her heirs.
