

Last Will and Testament of David Crockett
Georgia
Bibb County

I know all men by their persons that I David Crockett of the County and State of Georgia that I being in a low state of health and knowing that all men has once to die and I being in my proper mind I wish to dispose of my worldly goods as follows and I putting all confidence in my friend John D. Singletary to manage my business after my decease

First I wish all my perishable property to be sold and the monies arising from all sales of property to be appropriated to the use of my wife Elizabeth Crockett at her will. Also I wish my wife to have all my negroes namely Ned, Betty, Sarah, Bill, Edmund and Manah and to dispose of them as my wife thinks proper. Also I wish all my lands to be rented out yearly for the use of my wife as long as she lives, and after her decease I give all my lands to my brother's son Archibald Crockett also I wish all debts coming to me to be collected and put in the hands of my wife Elizabeth Crockett for her use and her disposal.

In witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the first day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ^{forty} _{two} David Crockett
