

Last Will and Testament of Francis H. Godfrey  
 In the name of God Amen

I Francis H. Godfrey of the County and State aforesaid, knowing the uncertainty of human existence, and while indulging the blessings of a sound & perfect mind and memory, do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in the manner and form following

- Item 1<sup>st</sup> - I give to my beloved wife Nancy Godfrey all my household and Kitchen furniture, with the exception of two bedsteads, and furniture for the same, and a dressing table and stand, also my plantation tools, saving and excepting a set of Blacksmith's tools, I have and to hold the same together with a horse called Knubbin, as per annex and property after my death.
- Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Francis H. Godfrey one Bed and bedstead and furniture, a dressing table and stand now used by her I have and to hold to her and her heirs forever.
- Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give and bequeath to my daughter George Virginia Godfrey one Bed, Bedstead and furniture for the same I have and to hold to her and her heirs forever, together my African negro woman Hannah, call short Hannah.
- Item 4<sup>th</sup> I give to my grandson Francis Harrison Godfrey Powder one shot gun.
- Item 5<sup>th</sup> I give to my relative now living with me James H. Harrison one year horse colt called Belfast, to him and his heirs forever.
- Item 6<sup>th</sup> It is my will and pleasure that after my death my Executors hereafter mentioned shall as soon as they deem it advisable proceed to sell all the balance of my property, not heretofore willed away including all hogs, negroes, carts, wagons, Blacksmith's tools, hoes, cows, hogs and all other stock now owned by me, and of which I may be possessed and all other property of which I have an interest, in giving such credit or time in the same of the same as they may deem fit, and the proceeds of the same together with the debts due me, after paying of my just debts to be appropriated and divided of them in the following manner First appropriating to my two daughters Francis H. Godfrey and George Virginia Godfrey three hundred dollars each over and above the portions allotted to my wife Nancy Godfrey and my daughter Mr. Susan Powell then the balance to be equally divided, share alike between my beloved wife Nancy Godfrey and my daughter, Martha Susan Powell. Francis H. Godfrey and George Virginia Godfrey to them and their heirs forever.
- Item 7<sup>th</sup> I give to my friend & notary marshall Henry S. Linn my Masonic Royal Arch Diploma my marks & jewels together with my other masonic articles and tokens for the high degree and rank for him.
