

Last will and Testament of Judah Collier
 In the name of our Father, Amen.
 I Judah Collier of said State and County being of sound
 age and knowing that I must shortly depart from this world
 deem it right and proper as respects myself and my family, that I
 should make a disposition of my property with which a kind Providence
 has blessed me.
 I therefore make this my last will and Testament, hereby making
 and annulling all other heretofore made by me.
 I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and
 Christian like manner, suitable to my circumstances and condition.
 My soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it as I
 hope for Salvation through the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.
 I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without
 delay by my Executors hereafter named, as I am unwilling
 my creditors should be delayed of their right, especially as there
 is no necessity for delay.
 I desire and direct that my beloved wife Temperance with whom
 I have lived in the strictest quiet and love, shall have and
 enjoy all my property both real and personal during her
 natural life without let or hindrance, of which I do profess
 for her own proper use and benefit, all to be kept together upon the
 plantation during her life - and I further desire that my son
 William shall live and remain with his mother during her life and
 to be supported out of the Estate free of charge.
 I further direct and desire that at the death of my beloved wife
 that all my real property be equally divided between my
 two daughters Caroline Foster and Sarah P. Griffin; in the division
 it is my wish that due regard be had to keeping families
 together as much as possible. I do further direct and desire
 that the property that each of my daughters aforesaid may
 fall heir to as above written, shall thence in their own proper
 person to have and to hold during their natural lives, subject
 to a sale of debts of any person or persons, and at their
 death or deaths for them to will the said property to whom
 they see fit.
 I further direct and desire that at the death of my
 beloved wife, that all my real estate, the plantation whereon I
 live, and all stocked of every kind, all the plantation tools, negro
 and household and kitchen furniture (with the exception of my
 bureau which I give extra to my daughter Caroline Foster) be
 sold by my Executors either at public or private sale as they
 think best, and all notes and money that may be on hand
 all to constitute a fund to be kept at interest. The interest
 of said fund to be set apart and added for the support
 of my son William by my Executors hereafter named.

6th I do further desire and direct that at the death of my son William, that the said fund, set apart for his support be then divided among each and all of my grand^{children} that may then be living or that may be born thereafter.

7th I desire further to leave to my two sons a debt of eight hundred dollars now in judgement against the Union Bank of Florida. The said debt, principal and interest to be equally divided in whole or in part when collected.

8th I further desire and direct that if any of the persons belonging to my estate become unable or unmanageable that Executors have power to sell them and take the money and put another in its place.

9th I constitute and appoint my beloved wife Temperance Executors and my two sons in law Gen Thomas M Coffin and Albert G Foster Executors to this my last will and Testament.

And I do further ordain and appoint my said sons in law trustees in right of my son William.
