Item First, My Will is that the sum of one thousand dollars
which I owe to William Waters with interest be first paid, then
the balance of some nine hundred dollars which I owe to Mathew
Suffernan. Afterward I desire all other just debts to be paid as soon as
may be convenient after my debts.

Item Second I give to my beloved wife Sarah Elizabeth the
whole of my Estate both real and personal, which remains after the
payment of my debts. She is to have full power to dispose of it
as she may think fitly well, but if she should die without
making a will then my whole estate shall go to her next of kin
