 Stabbs, in the sum of three thousand dollars to be paid unto the said Thomas  
 B. Stabbs, his executors, administrators, or assigns, to which payment well  
 and truly to be made we bind ourselves, jointly and severally and one and  
 each our heirs executors, and administrators firmly, by these presents, sealed  
 with our seals and dated at Macon this seventh day of September one  
 thousand, eight hundred and twenty four.

The Condition of this obligation is such, that if the above bounden  
 parties or either of them, on or before the first day of April one thousand  
 eight hundred and twenty seven, do make, or cause to be made unto the  
 said Thomas B. Stabbs, his executors, administrators or assigns a good and  
 sufficient title to the Middle third part of lot, Number Five in the Town  
 Fourth Square, of the Town lots of Macon, and the buildings and improve-  
 ments thereon, and do also suffer and permit the said Stabbs, so soon  
 after the making of these presents, as he shall make demand; to enter upon  
 and occupy, and enjoy the aforesaid premises and to take the profits thereof  
 to his own proper use, until the making of the said title, then this obli-  
 gation to be void else to remain in full force and virtue.
