it is right and proper both as respects myself
and family that I should make a disposition

has blessed me. I therefore make this my
will and testament, hereby revoking all
annulling all others heretofore made by me.

I trust I desire and wish that my body be buried
in a decent and Christian like manner suitable
to my Circumstances and Condition. My
Soul I trust shall return to rest with God
who gave it for Eternal Salvation through
our blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ
Whom I believe I have professed and as I
humbly trust - Enjoyed for the last thirty four
years -

And I give and devise to my beloved Son
Arthur Stotestrey who is my Eldest all my
rights and title and claim to one Sixth of
the property claimed by the Children of John
and Louisa Stotestrey viz:

That Certain part
or parcels of land in the town of St. Marys
Camden County Georgia. And known as part
of Lot No four (4) Situated lying and being in
the aforesaid town of St. Marys and bounded
as follows To wit:

One part fronting on
Osborne Street beginning at a line of a lot
belonging to Eliza Ann Mosby, thence running
South fifty feet to Mrs. Robert Williams
thence West One Hundred and thirty feet
to Osborne Street thence fifty feet North to
the place of beginning

Also one other lot
being part of Lot No four (4) bounded to the
East by Ready Street. Commencing at the
North East Corner of said lot No four (4)
and running South along Ready Street one
Hundred and fifty feet thence West
Two Hundred feet to Mrs. Louisa DeClamp
thence North One Hundred and fifty
feet thence East along Bryan Street
Two Hundred feet to the place of beginning

Item 4th I desire and require that all the rest of
my property both real and personal of
what I may be possessed, be sold at public
outcry, the proceeds to be Equally divided
into Six Equal parts, and one Sixth to be
given to my beloved son Arthur Stotestbury
Another Sixth part to be given to my beloved
son Peter Stotestbury, another Sixth part to be
given to my beloved son Henry Stotestbury, another
Sixth part to be given to my beloved son Saml
Stotestbury, another Sixth part to be given to my
beloved son George Stotestbury, another Sixth
part to be given to my beloved son Lewis
Stotestbury

Item 5th I constitute and appoint my beloved
sons Arthur and Henry Stotestbury Executors
of this my last will and testament this 7th
day of January, Eighteen Hundred and fifty
seven
