

Deed of Martha A. McGuire

State of Georgia I In the Name of God amen, I Martha A. McGuire
County of Bibb, of said State and County, being of advanced age but
of sound mind and memory; knowing that I must shortly depart
this life, deem it right & proper, both respects my family and
myself, that I should make a disposition of the Property with which
a kind Providence has blessed me, I do therefore, make this my
last Will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all others
by me hitherto made,

Item 1st I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent like manner
suitable to my condition and circumstances in life, my soul I trust
shall return to rest with God, who gave it, as I hope for salvation
through the merits and attainment of the blessed Saviour
Jesus Christ.

Item 2^d I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by
my Executors hereinafter named and appointed,

Item 3^d I give and bequeath to my daughter Eliza R. McGuire the sum
of five dollars,

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my daughter Georgia A. E. Russell wife
of Thomas J. L. Haffey the sum of five dollars,

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter, Charlotte F. Hancock
Hancock daughter of William H. Hancock the sum of five dollars,

Item 6th I give and bequeath to Mary A. Barry my daughter (to her free from
the debts and liabilities of her present or any future husband) one
fourth interest in all of my real and personal estate after paying off
the foregoing legacies, I also give and bequeath to Margaret A. Hancock
(my daughter) wife of Samuel B. Hancock one fourth interest in

all of real and personal estate after paying off the foregoing legacies,
I also give and bequeath to Antoinette A. Thomas (my daughter) wife
of William J. Thomas one fourth interest in all of my real and personal
estate after paying off the foregoing legacies, I give and bequeath to my

two Grand Daughters children, James A. and Missouri McGuire (being the
children of my deceased son William A. McGuire) the remaining one
fourth interest in all my property real and personal estate equally

between my two said Grand Children after paying off the foregoing
legacies, and in case of the death of one of my said named Grand
Children the survivor takes the deceased Grand Child's interest

above set forth.

Item 7th I hereby constitute and appoint my worthy friends and Son in law
Samuel B. Hancock Executor of this my Last Will and Testament
this 12th February 1864. Martha A. McGuire

and in the presence of each other doth further saith that they are
informed & believe that the said Elzey ^{signs} is a Soldier of the
reserv'd forces of the Confederate Army and is now out of the pur-
ortion of this County.

Last Will & Testament of Patrick R. Roach Deceased

In the Name of God Amen, I Patrick Roach of the County of
Bibb, and State of Georgia, being of sound and disposing
Mind, and being desirous to settle my worldly Estate
while I have Strength to do so, do make and Publish this my
will and Testament hereby revoking all wills by me at any time
heretofore made; And first I Commit my Soul to God who ga-
ve it, and my body I desire to be buried in Savannah in Cath-
olic Cemetery in the City of Savannah, and my worldly estate I dis-
pose of as follows: I will and bequeath to my wife Bridget M.
of Savannah Chatham County Georgia my Victoria house
Eighty \$19.80.00 due me by Major Bonard Big Artillery Gun
Legion and all other Effects either Personal or Real.
