 and memory and that she signed said will freely voluntarily and of her
 own accord and they each further say that E. L. Grannis the other subse-
 cribing witness sign the same and they and each of them at the time signed said will
 as witnesses at the request and in the presence of the said Martha W. McQuire
 and in the presence of each other deponent; further saith that they are
 informed & believe that the said E. L. Grannis is a Soldier of the
 reserved forces of the Confederate Army and is now out of the jur-
 isdiction of this Court,

 Eighty \$79.00 due me by Major Bonard's 8th Artillery Gun
 Legion and all other Effects either Personal or Real.

Last Will And Testament of David Allen Decd

State of Georgia I David Allen knowing that I must shortly depart this life do hereby make my last Will and Testament in full right and proper fashion as respects my Family and myself that I should make a disposition of the estate with which a kind Providence has blessed me and do therefore make this my last Will and Testament. I give and bequeath and devise to my beloved Wife Caroline I have several acres of land closed and in Cultivation including all the Wood land out of the swamp where my House stands with all the rights members and appurtenances to said land in anywise belonging free from all charge or limitation whatever to her use benefit and behoof forever with full power to dispose of the same at any time previous or by Will or deed at her death as she may think proper if when said give should be so far south to interfere with fish working of said river I wish then let a strip off running up to within half the distance of the end of the land thence crossing the road East as far as may be necessary around South West & North Six or eight acres as the Executor shall think necessary for clearing the purchaser to make to make the line fences, I desire that my Wife have two hundred Calves and their Stock or Progeny & two best saws and their tools I wish my Executor the balance of my Personal Property to sell when he think best and the balance of the Land I wish to be sold when my Executor thinks best to be to the interest of my children each one to draw a share when are two years after all Kitchen and Household furniture to my beloved wife and her Men in hands.

I hereby constitute and appoint my worthy friend Elijah Bond Executor of my last Will and Testament August 1st 1864
