

Last Will and Testament Bedden Rutland
in the name of God Amen

I Bedden Rutland a planter of the county of
Bibb and State of Georgia being in all health
but sound mind and memory do make this
my last will and Testament, utterly revoking all
former wills made by me and do declare this
to be my last will and Testament

First I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary
the use of a negro girl named Harriet and
her increase until my son Rufus King Rutland
becomes of age then I give and bequeath the
said negro girl and her increase to be equally
divided among all my children then living
which I have by my said wife Mary

Secondly It is my wish that my lands, stock and the
whole net and residue of my property be sold
immediately and after paying my just debts, it
is my wish that the remainder be equally divided
between my wife Mary and my children that I
have by her, the children's part to be put out
at interest for their use and maintenance

Lastly I hereby appoint Blake T. Rutland and John
Hylborn my Executors and request them to carry
this my last Will and Testament into effect
soon as practicable after my decease
