

Last Will and Testament of R. C. Feagin

State of Georgia I Robert C Feagin of the County of Chatham and State
Chatham County State do make this my Last Will and Testament hereby
revoking all others.

Item 1st I wish my debts paid by my Executors as soon as practicable.

Item 2^d I give and bequeath to my Sister Martha A Sharp my Gold Watch

Item 3^d I give devise Bequeath all the real & residue of my Estate
both real and personal to be equally divided between my
Mother Missouri Feagin, George M T Feagin, Henry C Feagin
and William Sharp or their issue,

Item 4th At the Death of my Mother the portion Bequeathed to her
to her in item the 3rd I wish to be equally divided
between George M T Feagin, Henry C Feagin and William
Sharp or their issue.

Item 5th my Brother Thomas C Feagin being dead, I further desire
that no portion of my property either real or personal shall
be given to his wife Ballie C Feagin or her heirs.

Item 6 I hereby empower my Executors to Sell any part or portion of my
property if necessary to make an equal division.

Item 7 I hereby constitute & appoint George M T Feagin, William
Sharp, Henry C Feagin Executors of this my Last Will and
testament revoking all others previously made by me.
