State of Georgia } I Robert C Meagin of the County of Chattham and said
Chattham County } State do make this my last Will and Testament hereby
revoaking all others.
Item 1st I wish my debts paid by my Executors as soon as practicable.
Item 2^d I give and bequeath to my Sister Martha A Sharp my gold watch
Item 3^d I give devise bequeath all the rest & residue of my Estate
both real and personal to be equally divided between my
my Mother Missouri Meagin, George M & Meagin, Henry S Meagin
and William Sharp or their issue.
Item 4th At the Death of my Mother the portion bequeathed to her
to her in item the 3^d I wish to be equally divided
between George M & Meagin, Henry S Meagin and William
Sharp or their issue.
Item 5th my Brother Thomas R Meagin being dead, I further desire
that no portion of my property either real or personal shall
be given to his Wife Sally R Meagin or her heirs.
Item 6 I hereby empower my Executors to sell any part or portion of my
property if necessary to make an equal division.
Item 7th I hereby constitute & appoint George M & Meagin, William
Sharp Henry S Meagin Executors of this my last Will and
testament, revoking all others heretofore made by me.
