First Second Third Last Will and Testament of Robert P. McEvoy dec'd By the name of God Amen, I Robert P. McEvoy being of sound mind and memory but weak in bodily health do make & claim this my last Will and Testament to Wits. I direct that my just debts be paid, I bequeath unto my mother Rachel Daniel, my wife Margaret McEvoy, and my three children, Edward Cook, Margaret Julia and Robert Porter the whole of my estate of all and every description after the payment of my just debts, funeral expenses & upon the following conditions, viz; that is to say, I desire that my property be kept together and so managed if practicable as to make an annual income sufficient for the support of my mother and wife, and the maintenance and education of my children, according to such a portion thereof as may be necessary to secure the above & be exposed of to the best advantage for the accomplishment of that during the lifetime of my mother, the widowhood of my wife and the minority of my children, but in the event of my wife's marriage she to draw from the estate one fifth, the remaining four fifths to be kept together for the benefit of my mother and my children as before, furthermore, as my mother, now living with me constitutes a part of my immediate family, I direct that in the event of her, withstanding that she be allowed to take at her bed room and a full proportion of household and kitchen furniture. In the event of the death of my mother and my three children in minority, I direct that the estate heretofore set apart be equally divided as follows viz; one third to my wife, one third to my children and the third to my mother.

 I, Robert P. McEvey, now residing in Merewether Co. Ga; and the remaining one
 third to my cousin Mrs. Leahy Ann Corley, Wife of Elizer Corley of
 Marion Co. Ga; and the heirs of the body; But in the further event
 of my three children dying under age or without issue my Mother and
 Wife still surviving, that the aforesaid property bequeathed to said
 children be divided as follows to wit: one fourth to my Mother one four
 to my Wife and the heirs of her body, one fourth to my Cousin John Part
 aforesaid and the remaining and last fourth to my Cousin Mrs. Ann
 Corley aforesaid and the heirs of her body.
 I do hereby constitute and appoint E. L. Grannis, J. A. Harris and Wm. J.
 Goodall my Executors to this my Last Will and Testament; and my
 Wife Margaret Jane McEvey as Guardian for my children Edward, Geo.
 Margaret Julia and Robert Part.
