My Last Will and Testament of Robert P. M. C. Ewary deceased  
 By the Name of God Amen, I Robert P. M. C. Ewary being  
 of sound mind and memory but weak in bodily health do  
 make and ordain this my last Will and Testament to witness  
 I direct that my just debts be paid  
 I bequeath unto my mother Rachel Daniel, my wife Margaret  
 C. Ewary, and my three children, Edward Ewary, Margaret wife of  
 Robert Porter, the whole of my estate of all and every description  
 after the payment of my just debts, funeral expenses to be upon the  
 following conditions, viz: that is to say, I desire that my property  
 be kept together and so manage & do if practicable as to have an  
 annual income sufficient for the support of my mother, my  
 wife, and the maintenance and education of my children otherwise  
 that such a portion thereof as may be necessary to secure the best  
 advantage for the accomplishment of that object  
 during the lifetime of my mother, the widowhood of my wife and the  
 minority of my children, but in the event of my wife's marriage she  
 to draw from the estate one fifth, the remaining four fifths to be left  
 together for the benefit of my mother and my children as before  
 furthermore, as my mother, now living with me constitutes a part  
 of my immediate family, I direct that in the event of her withdrawal  
 that she be allowed to take of her bed room and a full proportion  
 household and Kitchen furniture.

In the event of the death of my mother and my three children  
 minority, I direct that the estate hereof be set apart  
 equally divided as follows viz: one third to my wife  
 the other and the half to my three children

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I Robert Pitt McCrory dead  
I Carter now residing in Phenixville Ga; and the remaining one  
Third to my Cousin Mrs Leahany Ann Corley wife of Elihu Corley of  
Marion Co Ga) and the heirs of the body; But if in the further event  
of my three children dying under age or without issue my Mother and  
wife still surviving, that the aforesaid property bequeathed to said  
children be divided as follows to wit; one fourth to my Mother one four  
to my wife and the heirs of her body, one fourth to my Cousin John Carter  
aforesigned and the remaining and last fourth to my Cousin Mrs Leahany  
Ann Corley aforesaid and the heirs of her body.  
Fourth I do hereby constitute and appoint E. G. Grannis & T. A. Harris and Wm. H.  
Goodall my executors to this my Last Will and Testament; and my  
wife Margaret Jane McEvoy my Guardian for my children Edward  
Margaret Julia and Robert Carter.  
In testimony whereof I have affixed my signature and seal this 22<sup>nd</sup> day  
of July A.D. 1861. *Robert Pitt McCrory*
