

Will of James L. McCordle.

Brooks County In the name of God Amen.

I, James L. McCordle of the County and State aforesaid, being of sound and disposing mind, and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs do make and publish this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all Wills by me at any time heretofore by me made

First = I Com^{mit} my soul to God, who gave it, and my worldly Est. I dispose of as follows.

First I direct that ^{all} my debts be paid as soon as possible, after my decease, by my Ex^{ors}. Hereinafter named and appointed Secondly. The residue of my property both real and personal Whichever and whatever it may be, I give, bequeath and devise to my Minor Brothers, Benjamin Paulkin McCordle and Aurelius Henry McCordle to be used to assist in affording them the means to obtain an education, and it is my desire and Will, and I hereby so expressly direct that the entire property which, I bequeath them shall be used judiciously in providing them the means to obtain an education and for that purpose alone.

Lastly = I hereby appoint my trustworthly friend, John W. H. Mitchell Executor of this my last Will and Testament In Witness Whereof, I the said James L. McCordle to this my Will have set my hand and seal. This 25th day of July 1861.
