Will of James McMillen Dec'd

In the name of God. Amen

I, James McMillen of said State and County do make this my last Will and Testament

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid, by my Executors herein after appointed,

I give and bequeath to my dear and beloved wife, for her natural life all my land lying South and west of the public road leading from Thomasville to Madison Court-House together with that part of lot lying north and east of said road No. one hundred fifteen (115), in the fourth district of formerly Irwin, a part of lot No. one hundred sixteen (116), in said district, lot No. one hundred and thirty eight (138), part of lot No. one hundred and thirty seven, part of lot, one hundred and thirty six, 136, in the fifteenth district of said County, containing eight hundred acres more or less, my stock of hogs, sheep and cattle, household and kitchen furniture, plantation tools, four mules such as she may choose, and my cash, and five hundred dollars in money, my carriage and buggy, wagon, and crew and Cart, and at her decease, I will her lands to go to my son George, and daughter Margaret G. equally divided forever = I give and bequeath to all my children, my daughter Henrietta Davis, my son William B. my daughter Martha Groover, my daughter Josephine Denmark, my son John W. my son George, and my daughter Margaret G. the residue of my entire estate, whatever or whomever it may be, including ^{that} given to my beloved wife, Henrietta during her natural life after her estate there is over, except the land given to George and Margaret G. to be equally divided among them all.
