Item 2nd I wish and desire all my just debts to be paid
as speedily as possible as I see no good cause for
delay

Item 3rd I then wish my whole Estate consisting of the
Place whereon my family now lives with my
stock of Horses Hogs Cattle sheep Household and
Kitchen furniture together with any money and
notes that may be on hand together with all
other property of whatever kind that I may have
at the time of my death; I wish and desire should
be worked together and kept together as it
now is for the benefit of my whole family espe-
cially for the benefit of my beloved wife
Mary Goorts during her natural life and
after her death I wish and desire the whole
to be equally divided among the whole of
my legal heirs
