

Will of Leary Stanley (Deceased)

State of Georgia In the name of God. Amen. I, Leary  
Brooks County } Stanley, of said State and County, being  
of a raman age and knowing that I must shortly depart  
this life, deem it right and proper both as it respects my  
family and myself, that I should make a disposition of the  
property with which a kind Providence has blessed me, do  
therefore make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking  
all other heretofore made by me.

Item first

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without  
unnecessary delay by my executors hereinafter appointed

Item second

After the above has been complied with, I desire and direct  
that the Est. left by me shall be kept together until such  
time as I or of this my Will, and my dear Wife Charity  
shall deem it best and agree to close up the Est. and have a  
final distribution, which they may effect either by sale  
of Estate, or division at their discretion

Item third

I desire and direct, that my heirs to wit: My Wife Charity  
and daughter Sarah M. Mary Susan, Martha C. Ann, and  
Sons, William, John, and James B. R. shall each have an  
equal portion of said estate with the following exception  
viz My Wife Charity and daughter Mary to have one hundred  
and dollar each the advantage of the others,

Item fourth

In order to carry the above into effect, I hereby constitute  
and appoint my sons, William, and James B. R. Executors  
of this my last Will and Testament with powers transcending  
those usually granted in similar cases in as much as  
I wish them invested with power to sell, purchase, exchange  
or make any other disposition of property that they may  
deem for the best interest of the Est. without the necessity  
of an order of Court, for any of those purposes.
