 may have to be hers for and during her life time. My Execu-
 tor to have the power to sell and use said property as in his
 judgment will be most for the benefit, advantage and com-
 fort of my said wife Mary Ann.

Third Should there be any property left after the death of my said
 wife, then what remains I desire to be equally divided between
 the brothers and sisters of my wife, who may be living at the
 time of her death. I hereby appoint my friend B. M. C.
 Lewis Executor of this my last will and Testament; and
 authorize him to expend the whole of my estate in the support
 of my wife if necessary. Though if there should be a remain-
 der, I desire it to be divided as above directed.
