

Will of Thomas N Slaughter Deceased
State of Georgia In the name of God Amen
Randolph County } I Thomas N Slaughter of said
State and County being of Advanced age, but of sound
and disposing Mind, and Memory, knowing that I must
shortly depart this life, deem it right and proper both
as respects my family and myself that I should make
a disposition of the property with which a kind pro-
vidence has blessed me, I do therefore make this my last
will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all
others by me heretofore made.

First

I desire and direct that my body be buried in a
decorous Christian like manner suitable to my condition
and situation in life. My soul I trust will return to
rest with God who gave it, as I hope for salvation through
the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord and Saviour
Jesus Christ.

Secondly

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid
without delay by my Executrix herein after named and
appointed

Thirdly

I give and bequeath and devise to my beloved wife
Mirza Slaughter, the place wherein I now live containing
three hundred acres of land in said County and State
and a house thereon One hundred and forty six feet
and lot of land in said County and State and thereon
no number One thousand and forty four (144) containing
two hundred and two and a half acres, with all the
rights, members and appurtenances to the same in any way
belonging.

Fourthly

It is my Will desire and intention that my beloved
wife Mirza Slaughter shall have the full right and
title to said land and the entire control of the
same with all the rights and privileges now and hereafter
existing from the same during her natural life with
the right in her discretion to sell and dispose of
said lands, the proceeds arising from the sale same
to be reinvested in other real estate subject to the
same provisions limitations time and restraint
as the original said lands before mentioned.

Fifthly

It is my Will desire and intention that my beloved
wife Mirza Slaughter shall have the full control
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provisions of every kind plantation tools including Wagons Carts
Carriages Household and Kitchen furniture and every thing of
value which I hold in my own right and that may be found in
my possession at the time of my death not otherwise disposed of
for and during the term of her Natural life with power at her
discretion to sell and dispose of the same and in case the
proceeds of the sale of the personal property shall be exhausted
by her in living she shall not be responsible to my children
or any one else for the same it being my distinct and solemnly
declared Will and intention that my said wife shall have
full power and control of said personal property and the
proceeds of the sale thereof but at the time of her death should
any of said personal property or the proceeds thereof be in hand
the same shall be disposed of as herein after mentioned

It is my will and desire and intention that my beloved
wife Eliza Slaughter shall have all of my Notes and accounts
and evidences of debt of every description to be used and
disposed of in the same manner and under the same pro-
visions and restrictions as mentioned in the preceding art-
icle relative to my other personal property

It is my Will intention and desire that should my beloved
wife Eliza Slaughter see fit and this is proper at any
time during her widowhood or in the event of her marriage
to divide said property both real and personal with our
children as far as her life estate here is retained and
conveyed shall be concerned she shall have the power
to do so but this shall be left entirely at her discretion

It is my Will intention and desire that at the expiration
of the life estate herein created that the property herein
named both real and personal etc, as to me restrictions
hereinbefore mentioned shall be equally divided between
our children Thomas H. Slaughter Augustus E. Slaughter
and Susan Emma Slaughter holding in each of them a
life Estate in the same and no Estate in remainder with
out limitation at the death of either of them to their children
and at the death of either one of them his or her interest
shall vest in the survivor or survivors provided he or she
shall die without a child or children but if either
one should die leaving a child or children his or her
intestate in said Estate shall go to said child or
children

a bequest and desire and more explicitly expressing
my intention it being my Will and intention that

Beneficiaries, and shall not be liable to sale for the
debts August 29th 1867

And whereas I am desirous of attuning and changing the bequests and devise in the third (3rd) article of said Will (having disposed of the property therein named and investing in other property) therefore make and publish this Codicil to said Will and Testament.

I revoke and annul the said third article of said Will.

I give bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Thirza Slaughter the place recently purchased from H. G. Bomar two embracing the west half of Lot of Land No three hundred and seven (307) containing two hundred and forty acres more or less, also part of lot of Land number three hundred and thirty eight (338) commencing at the South West corner of said lot and running West to the first Spring branch then down the run of said branch to Mill Creek and along the run of said Creek to the northern boundary line containing sixty acres more or less both tracts or parcels situate lying and being in the 12th District of Brooks County, To her use and to hold the property so devised to her own proper benefit and behoof to be disposed of as my said wife may see proper after my death provided the proceeds of the sale of said Land (should she so dispose of the property) be reinvested in other real estate this November 20th 1869.
