

Will of William A. Dawson

State of Georgia ^{On the name of God Amen}
Dawson County Feb 1st 1863 Dawson being of sound mind and of good memory with the other faculties of the mind in healthy exercise do make and publish this as my last Will and Testament hereby revoking others which I have hitherto made

Item 1st

I direct that my mortal remains be decently interred as is customary by my Executor hereafter to be made

Item 2^d

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Naomi A. Dawson the following property to wit, namely a negro girl about thirteen years old named Rachael of dark complexion one Bedstead One Bed and furniture

Item 3^d

I give and bequeath to my beloved children Mary Dawson and William Bryan Dawson the following property to wit One Negro Boy Sparrow about twenty years of age of dark complexion also money, notes, accounts, house hold and kitchen utensils with all my other effects whatsoever

Item 4th

It is my will and desire that if my wife above mentioned should marry for my Executor hereafter named to take charge of my children and effects

Item 5th

It is my will and desire that if my children should die without issue then the property given in Item 3rd should go back to my brothers and sisters to be equally divided between them

Item 6th

I hereby appoint my Brother in Law James B. Peacock my Executor of this my last Will and Testament

Dawson sign and subscribe the foregoing and acknowledge as his last Will and Testament to be sound and disposing of his mind, that the same was so done in his presence and in the presence of the said Henry Durden and John H. Dawson.

The last Will of William A. Drison a citizen of Brooks County who recently died in Twiggs County having been brought before this Court for probate two of the witnesses thereto residents of Twiggs County having stated on oath that the witnesses thereto are all residents of Twiggs County that William A. Drison was at the time of his death a citizen of Brooks County and that he died in Twiggs County when his last Will was attested and Henry Gordon and John H.
