

Will of Elizabeth Sherrington Sen.

Georgia } Whereas Elizabeth
Bryan County } Sherrington of said State
and County did on the thirty first day
of March Eighteen hundred and Eighty
one (1881) execute three certain Deeds made by
Ardselia Sherrington my Wife and her
daughter Ardselia C. Sherrington one to Solomon
B. Sherrington my son and one to Zachariah
Sherrington my Son and recorded in the Clerk's
Office of the Superior Court of said County
in Book L beginning on page 270. Recorded
on the 18th of April 1881 - by which said Deeds
then, is a clause giving the Control and
management of the property conveyed by
said Deeds to the said Elizabeth Sherrington
during her life, and after that time may
arise some doubt as to the construction
of said deeds as to whether they are testamentary
or would be so considered at my
death - There being but two witnesses to said
Deeds - Therefore to avoid any trouble in the
matter and to ratify and confirm the said
Conveyance or Deeds as above, then deed
made to my Son Solomon B. Sherrington on
the 19th day of January Eighteen hundred
and eighty three and recorded on the twenty-
fifth day of January 1867 at the
Clerk's Office of the Superior Court of said
County, the Book L folio 248 - and also to make
my disposition of property not included
in said Deeds I therefore do make and
constitute the following as my last Will
and Testament -

I am first - I give my soul to God who
gave it - Looking for resurrection Through

the atonement of Jesus Christ.

Item 2nd I desire all my just debts to be paid, but not from any money or proceeds arising from any property heretofore conveyed by me, by deed to my wife Ardolia Sherman and children, by me as I do not claim or own said property thereby conveyed only claiming the control and management during my life as set forth in said Deeds.

Item 3rd I hereby ratify and confirm the Execution of the Deeds heretofore and above mentioned, and desire that the property mentioned in each of them be distributed according to true intent and meaning of said Deeds.

Item 4th after the payment of my just debts all the property left either real or personal I desire to be divided equally share & share alike between all my children or their representation and my wife Ardolia Sherman she taking as one of the children.
