**By the Honorable the Justices of the Inferior Court of said County,
Sitting for Ordinary purposes:**

WHEREAS, *Daniel J. Evans*, late of this County, deceased, died intestate, having, while he lived and at the time of his death, divers estates, real and personal, within the County aforesaid, by means whereof the full disposition and power of granting the administration of the estate of the said deceased, and also a final dismissal from the same, to the Court aforesaid doth of right belong; they, desiring that the same may be well and truly administered and legally disposed of, do hereby grant unto *Elisha A. Allen* administrator full power by the tenor of these presents to administer the entire estate, both real and personal, of said deceased, which to him in his lifetime and at the time of his death did belong, and to ask, demand, sue for, recover, and receive the same, and to pay the debts in which the deceased stood bound so far forth as his assets will extend, according to law, and then the balance jointly to pay over to the legal heirs and distributees of the said deceased. And the said *Elisha A. Allen* having given bond and security and taken the oath and performed all other requisites required by law, necessary to just qualification as administrator, he is, by order of said Court, and by virtue of these presents, ordained, constituted, and appointed Administrator of the whole estate, both real and personal, of said deceased.
