In the name of God Amen, I B. Perkins, of the County and State aforesaid do make and declare this to be my last will and testament in manner and form as follows

- 1st I give my soul to God who gave it me and my body to the Earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executor.
- 2nd I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah F. Perkins the tract of Land on which I now live containing Sixty acres, more or less also the balance of the same tract containing One hundred and four acres containing in all One hundred and Sixty four acres, more or less, also all the ^{two} stocks of Cattle and Swine that belong to the place on which I now live and, Chaise Horses to be Selected by my beloved wife, also one years provisions; also six Negroes namely, Sam a man; Walter a man, Elie a boy, Right a boy, Spina a woman and Cressy a woman; the above named Land, Stock, provisions and Negroes to belong to my wife Sarah F. Perkins during her life time, and after her death to be equally divided among all my Children or Childrens Children as the case may be; I further give unto my beloved wife as much of the household ^{& kitchen} furniture as she may want, to be disposed of in the same manner as the above named property at her death.
- 3^d My will is that all my debts be paid, and to enable my Executor to do so, it is my wish, that my Executor ^{Bulke Co. GA Will Bk A} do proceed to sell my plantation ^{www.georgiapioneers.com} over Big Rock Head Creek and if that is not sufficient to pay all my debts that he proceed to sell as much of my perishable property as will enable him to pay all my just debts, after all this is done my will is that all the balance of my property of every kind not disposed of before, be equally divided among all my Children this division to be made in whatever manner my ^{son} may think proper requesting him however not to sell any of my Negro property.

Lastly - I do hereby appoint my beloved son F. W. Perkins my Executor.

therein it is ordered that said will be admitted to record and
that letters testamentary do issue to Freeman W B Perkins the executor
named therein. And it is further ordered that a warrant of appraisement
do issue to
interests of the law.

J Edward Gachick Ordinary of Burke County certifies that the original

January 1856

original will of Brinson & Perkins deceased late of Burke County
was destroyed by fire on the 24th January 1856 at the burning of

The petition of Freeman W B Perkins Executor of Brinson & Perkins
deceased late of said County respectfully sheweth that on the tenth
day of August Eighteen hundred and fifty three in said County Brin
son & Perkins then in life made and duly executed his last will and
testament a copy of which is hereto attached. That said original
being deposited by your Petitioner in the office of the Ordinary of said
County was on the 24th of January 1856 destroyed by fire at the burning
of the Court house of said County - That said will had been proved by the
oath of the executor named therein (your Petitioner) That he is advised
that said probate is not sufficient in law but that the said will should
be proved by one of the witnesses to the same. Your petitioner avers that
he is the only named executor of said will. That the legates under said
will are Sarah F Perkins, Sarah F Gregory, formerly Sarah F Perkins whose
guardian is Simon Wallace George W Perkins, Andrew G Perkins, Mary
G Perkins, John W Perkins, Henry C Perkins, and Susannah B S Perkins whose
guardian is Sarah F Perkins Mary E Wallace a granddaughter whose
guardian is Abel E Wallace and Freeman W B Perkins your Petitioner
