Be it remembered that Mary Churchill of the State of Georgia
and County of Burke being of sound mind and of
sound disposing mind and memory do make order
and in this her last will and Testament in manner
and form following that is to say.

I do commend my soul to Almighty God and
of the child of the which I am now pregnant should
be born and since I give and bequeath unto said child
all the negroes named in the list made from Calvin
to John and my own share to myself together with all
their future increase provided if the said child
should be a male and die in its minority or should
it be a female and die in its minority or without
being married then and in that case I give and
bequeath the whole of said negroes and increase in said
list together with all their future increase to my
dear Brother John W. Livingston out in case the
said John W. Livingston should die without a lawful
wife or children then and in that case it is
my will and desire that the said of said negroes
should be equally divided between my Brother Benjamin
J. Livingston and John W. Livingston Dr. With
Clinton and to the said John W. Livingston my sister Angeline
Larson children of my former husband Larson
Clinton to be equally divided there and
there alike.

I do hereby appoint my Brother Benjamin
J. Livingston & John W. Livingston the Executors to this
my last will.
