may be by the sum of Fifty and her children Elizabeth
Peggy a boy also my close carriage and the two carriage horses
and a sufficient comfortable support together with the use
of my dwelling house and my plantation in Burke County
and the use of my several houses in Rockwell County and at
the marriage or death of my said wife the aforesaid property be
apportioned to her as aforesaid is to be equally divided one half
to be given to my son Philip Allen Sapp and the other half to
rest in my executors for the use of my daughter for the sole and separate
use of my daughter Sidney Ann Elizabeth Sapp the whole subject
to be under the limitations and provisions as are hereinafter expressed.
All the rest and remainder of my estate I desire and direct
that the same be kept together to be managed under the
care and direction of my executors as they may think
best leaving out the surplus money at interest or profit
separately or paying the same in good money and I do hereby
shall have full power by Philip Allen Sapp.

and Sister have departed this life leaving me the sole to stand in the place and stead of and receive the share of property which would have been received had they been living. I do hereby name my said daughter Sidney Ann Elizabeth Sapp should marry before my son arrives at the age of twenty one years he being an heir then my Executors will set apart and leave to my said daughter for her sole and separate use Twenty Negroes or families until the time my son shall marry at the age of twenty one years

I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my friends William Sapp and James Ward of the County of Burke the Executors of this my Last Will and Testament and the guardians of my said Children and the Trustee of my said daughters and her Children having full power in my said friends that they will take care of the property Education of my said Children according to my Estate and Will and will fully and faithfully execute the my last request of them by executing this my Last Will and Testament

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this Seventh day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty five and published this as my last Will and Testament
