Item 1st I wish my body to be buried in a decent manner.
2^d I wish all my honest debts to be paid, appropriating for such
purpose the hire of Hannah for the year Eighteen hundred and
fifty Eight, and should this be insufficient I desire my heirs to liquidate the balance, should they be indisposed to do this I wish the
amount made up out of my perishable property.
3 I Leave to my daughter Sarah Humphreys Ten Dollars.
4 I Leave to my daughter Jane Grubbs the sum of Ten Dollars.
5 I leave to my son William R. Lipsey during his natural life my
negro woman slave Hannah and her increase and after his death

Should he and his child or children
die, I wish the said girl or woman slave Hannah to revert to Georgia
Carratt, the daughter of Civil Carratt and the child or children of Jane
Grubbs, if she should have any, the above mentioned woman slave
Hannah not to be subject to any previous or after debt or contract
of the said Wm R Lipsey or any husband of the said Georgiana
Carratt or child or children of the said Jane Grubbs.
6 I give in trust to Georgiana Carratt a certain slave child named Adeline
for her sole and exclusive use and benefit, not subject to any debt or con-
tract of any husband or person whatever.
Item 7 I appoint my friend William C. Mcgregor as my Executor and Trustee.
In witness of the above I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
fifteenth day of February in the year of our Lord (1857) Eighteen hun-
dred and fifty Eight.

notified - it is ordered that said last will & testament be ad-
mitted to record and filed in this office in terms of the law.

raisement do issue to Allen Egan, Francis A. Jones, Wm. N. W.
