The last will and Testament of Mary J. Lipp late decedent of Berkeley County having been produced in open Court by Caroline & Minnie Overholts & proved in due form by the affidavit of John J. Jones, Ball Jones and John J. Jones the three subscribing witnesses thereto it was ordered that said last will and Testament be & is hereby admitted to record in this office in books of the laws - That hereafter the same do come to Caroline & Minnie the Executors named therein and that a warrant of appointment be issued to Thomas Jones William Jones John J. Jones Joseph J. Jones and John J. Jones to administer the Estate of said deceased in terms of the Statute in such cases made and provided.

Wilkes County In the name of God Amen I Henry J
Lipp of said State and County being of advanced age, memory
failing, that I should make a disposition of the property
with which a kind Providence has blessed me, do hereby
make this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking all
others heretofore made by me.

Article 1 I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid
as soon as practicable by my hereafter named Executors.

Article 2 I give, bequeath and devise unto my affectionate daughter
- in law - Caroline Elizabeth Linn (wife of my late deceased
son - Henry C. Linn) - all my property of every character and
description, both real and personal - left after the payment
of my debts as above specified - it to take the same in
fee - Simple.

Article 3 I hereby constitute and appoint my said daughter - in law
Caroline Elizabeth Linn Executor of this my last will and
Testament.

hand and affixed my seal - this the third day of April 1858
